Welcome Interview With Josh Raspberry Interviewed by Taylor Park, Executive Pastor

At the December Session meeting, First Evan's Session voted unanimously to call Josh Raspberry to join our staff as Pastor of Family Ministry. Many of you have had opportunity to meet Josh through either the Family Engagement class he taught or the town hall held with he and his wife, Jane, on November 28th. Josh will assume his duties here sometime after the first of the year as he is able to finish well in his current role as a Bible teacher at Briarcrest. But, be on the lookout, you just might see him around before then. We asked Josh a few questions to help us get to know him and his family.

Taylor: Josh, give us a quick overview of your background. Where were you born and raised? Where did you go to school?

Josh: I was born in Jonesboro, AR and grew up in Maumelle, a suburb of Little Rock, AR. I went to High school at Central Arkansas Christian and college at Ouachita Baptist University. Since then, I graduated from Liberty University: Rawlings School of Divinity and UT-Martin.

T: Tell us a little about your story of coming to faith?

J: I grew up the son of a deacon and a children's choir director. We were *very* active at church! On top of that, I've always been a pretty good person who likes to follow the rules. Yet, at around nine years old, the Holy Spirit grabbed hold of me and revealed to me that I was a sinner in need of a Savior. Nothing dramatic, just a dead person coming to life and beginning the journey of faith.

T: Tell us about Jane. When and where did y'all meet and what are her gifts and passions?

J: Well, first of all, Jane is all kinds of amazing! As a wife, a mother, a friend...she's the best. We met our freshman year of college at OBU and started dating very soon after we met and married a couple years later. She is a gifted teacher, both of science and Scripture, a wise counselor and a trustworthy confidant. She is passionate about teaching women and pointing people to Jesus. For fun, she enjoys decorating and photography and hanging out with the family!

T: So, you have three kids. Tell us a little about each of them.

J: God has certainly blessed us with our kids! All of them currently attend Briarcrest. Chloe is in 10th grade and loves all things theater and the arts. She is a gifted singer and crazy smart. Lydia is in 8th grade. She loves music and runs on the Middle School cross-country team. Lydia is a hard worker and possibly the most organized of any of us! Caleb is the youngest and is our resident dinosaur expert. He also loves to sing and act.

T: You are not new to ministry. Please tell us about some of your past ministry experiences.

J: Before vocational ministry, I was very involved in various lay ministries. From choir and orchestra to mission trips and VBS I did it all. When God called us into vocational ministry, I began as a bi-vocational pastor in the tiny town of Omaha, AR. I served there for two years, learning a lot of lessons about shepherding and leadership. From there, we went to Bluffton, SC where I served as Pastor of Discipleship. There, I focused on small groups and new member assimilation. We made some wonderful friendships there and definitely loved living close to the beach! Next, we spent six years in Corning,



AR where I served as senior pastor of Corning First Baptist Church. At Corning, I learned many invaluable lessons about pastoral leadership, especially during COVID.

T: Josh, when you think about assuming this role at First Evan, what excites you the most?

J: Easy...the people! Every interaction I have had, I have witnessed a body who is passionate about seeing Christ glorified and people saved. I have witnessed a body who loves its staff and fellow members deeply, who trusts its leadership, and who is trusting God to do what only He can do. In the brief time I have spent with the staff, I see their joy in service and desperate hope to be used for the Kingdom.

T: Can you give us two or three specific prayer requests for you and your family as you make this transition to this new ministry at First Evan?

J: Of course! 1: That God would give me the energy and wisdom to serve well, rely on God fully, and grow in my own faith. 2: That my family and I will quickly get settled in and begin to build great relationships at FEC. 3: That I will adjust well to my new schedule and faithfully love, lead, and be present for my family as we make this transition.





Sometimes I think that I am prevented from accomplishing a goal by circumstances outside of my control. Then those circumstances are removed and, with no excuse to hide behind, I find that I was really the problem all along. It is easy to feel like we can't "go" to the nations when we live in the middle of the US, but the nations are coming right into our backyard. We have an incredible opportunity to reach out from our own homes, no passport needed!

In fact, I think we are particularly well-positioned here in the US. The people who have come from all over the world are in a very vulnerable position whether they come as refugees fleeing violence or as the "best and brightest" of their country arriving here to study or work. They have left home, family, community, comfort food, pets, and all that is familiar and they come to a wildly foreign place where they likely arrive not knowing anyone at all.

When I was in college, I had the privilege of studying abroad in South Korea. I lived in a dorm room with 4 bunk beds and 7 Korean roommates. Despite the fact that I traveled there with two friends, I often was lonely and overwhelmed, and my roommates were shy and kept to themselves. One night I cried myself to sleep in my bed, seemingly unnoticed. But the next day two of my roommates invited me to share some grapes with them. I rarely have experienced such meaningful hospitality. The simplest offerings can be so powerful in a moment of great need.


Statistics show that 70-75% of international students never see the inside of an American home, despite eagerness to experience American life. Never. This is a disturbing number, and it reveals that living in the US is not what is keeping us from reaching out to the nations. The harvest is plentiful, right in our backyard.
