TLAPANECO—God's Fruit in Mexico by Hickman Ewing, Global Missions Team

God has done a great work in and through First Evan among the Tlapaneco people of southern Mexico. It's a thrilling story which will be highlighted at our upcoming **Global Missions Conference**. In a miraculous series of events, in 1938 God led Mr. H.V. Lemley, to a people who had never been reached with the Gospel. A year later—on October 21, 1939—Mr. Lemley married Mildred Lewis at First Evan and they headed to Mexico on their honeymoon. They walked for 10 days to a village and moved into a thatch-roofed, mud-floor hut. They would live and work in Mexico for the rest of their lives. **First Evan has supported this Gospel ministry among the Tlapanecos continually ever since.**

In the early years, support was for the Lemley family, but as the Gospel spread and the ministry grew, First Evan continued to support all aspects of the ministry, including: sending young people to Bible school, funding outreach events, conferences, projects, and the construction and ongoing ministry of the Tlapaneco Christian Churches (ICT).

The Lemleys learned the difficult tonal language, very different from Spanish, with the **primary goal of translating the Scriptures**. As they translated, they shared the good news of Jesus Christ (the Gospel).

Where only idolatry ruled in the hearts of the people, NOW Christ rules in many hearts. Where people worshipped the rain god, NOW many worship the Lord Jesus Christ. Where one couple came to bring the news of redemption to the people of the mountains, **NOW the people themselves bring the good news of redemption to those outside of Christ.**

A man named Catarino became the first convert through the Lemleys' ministry in the early 1940s. The Lemleys helped raise his son, Aniceto, who became the first Tlapaneco evangelist. In 1953 Ruben Gaytan (then age 12) came to live with the Lemleys in Cuernavaca.

When Mrs. Lemley passed away in 1972, Ruben came alongside Mr. Lemley in the ministry as his "Timothy." They continued the work, which saw more and more Tlapanecos become true believers in Christ. More churches and missions were started in the tribe. In the 1980s the mission started sending young people to Bible school. Among the first Tlapaneco young people to graduate from this school were: Abel Espinosa Rosas (now Director of the Tlapaneco Bible School) and Leticia Aguilar (daughter of Aniceto, and the granddaughter of the first Tlapaneco convert).

Upon Mr. Lemley's death in 1993, Ruben became Director of the ministry in Mexico. In 1997, Ruben married Leticia, who had been serving as a missionary in the mountains. A large group from First Evan traveled to Tlapa for this wedding and prayed over newly-acquired property (on which the Tlapaneco Christian Center/Bible School now stands).

Today, there are 50 churches and missions and 44 full time workers. The ICT Board oversees the work of the ministry, visiting and encouraging the various groups of believers throughout the mountains. Between 800 and 900 from all the churches/missions are expected to come together in El Llano between Palm Sunday and Easter for worship, fellowship, Bible teaching, and encouragement.

God willing, Abel (Bible School Director) and Galo (VP of the ICT Board) will be joining us here at our Global Missions Celebration in February. We hope you'll join us!

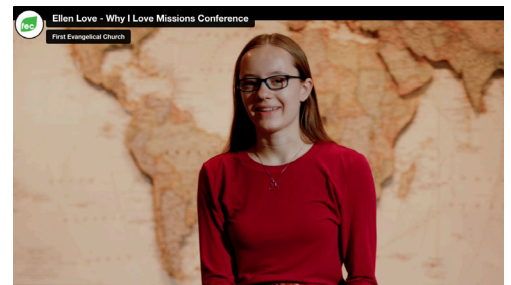
Using Your Talents for Missions—Even Songwriting?

Community Arts Tokyo (CAT), a ministry founded by Roger and Abi Lowther, was the special project focus of the 2023 FEC Global Missions Conference. Funds raised allowed for various community outreach events during which art was used to share the gospel. At one of these events, Anna Gardner Herren, a summer intern with CAT, performed a ballet dance that became a powerful tool in the hands of the Lord. Following is an excerpt of her testimony explaining what God did.

"I met K on the night of my first performance...I danced a ballet piece about Mary, telling the story of Christmas through Mary's eyes. After the show, I was introduced to K, who came with her parents. She told me that she was impacted by the dance because she is also a dancer! She asked me many questions about the piece "Mary's Song."

Through a translator, I was able to tell her the story of the gospel. In return, she told me that she had felt God's presence during that dance, and said that she felt the Lord was calling her to Himself. You can imagine my surprise! K had been to church perhaps three times in her life and was simply not interested in God. However, she strongly felt the call of the Holy Spirit that night, and she wanted to become a Christian."

Thank you, First Evan, for giving so generously to this ministry last year. Let's rejoice in what God did through us, and CAT!

"The Great Jungle Journey" VBS

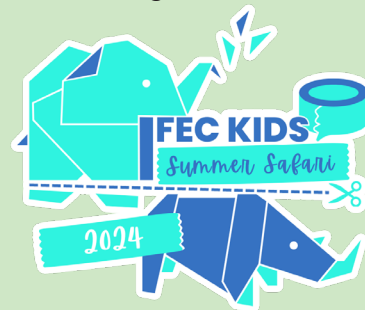

MEMPHIS MINISTRIES

Abortion is Illegal, But She Had Abortion Paperwork in Her Hand...

Meet me at the MCFL table in the Fellowship Hall on Sunday, February 11 to learn more about the ministry!

This morning, I was reminded about why it is **absolutely vital** to continue sidewalk advocacy in Tennessee despite the abortion ban.

I spent a shift with our Women's Care Network program on the sidewalk outside Planned Parenthood. While I was there, two women came out of Planned Parenthood together. I offered one of our gift bags, and they came over to me. I offered a free pregnancy test and ultrasound.

"I need an ultrasound," one woman said and she looked down at her paperwork in her hand, gesturing to one paragraph, "they told me I still need my ultrasound, but I don't have any money with me today." I knew that meant she was planning on having an abortion. **She had the abortion paperwork in her hand.** Once she had her ultrasound performed by Planned Parenthood, she would be scheduled for an abortion in Illinois. I offered to walk her over to Life Choices next door, and she accepted.

"I'm nervous," she told me. "This is my second baby, and I'm barely making it by with one. I believe in God, and I've been praying. But I just don't know how I'm going to make it unless I go through with this abortion."

I told her I understood there are challenges with having a second baby, but there are so many resources available to her. **She had no idea there was help here in Memphis for her.** I gave her my phone number, and reassured her Memphis Coalition for Life and the pro-life community as a whole would help her with all of the difficulties she admitted were influencing her decision. She thanked me profusely.

You can keep "E" in your prayers as she walks through the next steps of care.

Sadly, how "E" felt before meeting us is not uncommon. Women facing unplanned pregnancies in Memphis are still largely unaware of the help available to them through the pro-life community. Women like "E" will continue to seek abortions even though abortion is illegal in Tennessee. In fact, since October 2022, 3,060 Tennessee women have traveled to abortion facilities in Illinois.

Many of these women (like "E") will visit our Memphis abortion-referral centers before making the trip to Illinois.

Abortion has been outlawed in Tennessee, but this is the sad reality our community is still facing. **The abortion industry wants Memphis women to have abortions.** Note, they are not offering any resources to help with her unplanned pregnancy. *Their offer of help is to kill her unborn baby.*

We, as dedicated pro-life Christians, *must* intercede for her and her unborn child. We must be there on the sidewalk to offer her that practical help she so desperately needs in this absolutely vital time—the moments before she commits to have an abortion. **Moms like "E" need us.** We will provide tools to help you save babies from abortion and help vulnerable moms find life and hope in Christ.

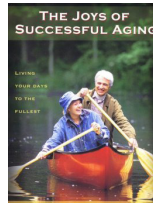

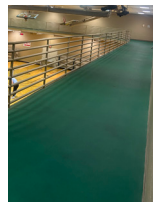
