WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT

The Kindness of a Friend

"For the despairing man there should be kindness from his friend; / Lest he forsake the fear of the Almighty" (Job 6:14).

A man watched the sun rise on what promised to be another perfect day. Life had been exceedingly good to him. His business and farming pursuits had prospered; his wealth was secure and well-managed; his large family enjoyed being together.

But the day's prospects turned dark when word reached this man that his entire fleet of work vehicles had been stolen and all his drivers (save one) slain. He had hardly heard this report when another arrived: A freak accident involving a flaming meteor had decimated the man's livestock and taken the lives of all his ranchhands (save one). Another report came on the heels of the previous: His product distribution company had been decimated by three coordinated terrorist attacks. The package-carriers had vanished; the entire work force (save one) had been slain. Then came a fourth report: A freak storm with straight-line winds of gale force had flattened the villa where his children were gathered together for a party. All had perished.

There are no words to describe the sense of hopelessness and despair which must have borne down upon the heart of Job, the man to whom all these things happened on a single day. In Job 6:14, he reveals how far such hopelessness could drive him: He feels it pushing him to jettison even what had been the very compass of his being, his devotion to God. Job has not cast God aside (Job 6:10), but he feels the brute force of despair driving him toward such an end.

Job declares that there is a force which can diminish the power of such despair, the kindness of a friend. A hopeless heart can be rescued from abandoning God! How does this work? When such a man is supported by his brother, he is gently reminded, "ALL is not lost—at least you have a friend." And when that friend offers kindness, this heavy heart dares to hope, "If a friend can show me kindness, then I am not beyond it. Perhaps God will show me kindness, too."

So who do you know who is facing despair? Who among those you would name as friends is carrying a burden of disappointment, sadness, loss, and despair. He is in spiritual danger. His heartache can push him away from God. But if you will draw close to him, and find ways to express kindness in your words and acts of grace, you will not only encourage a brother. You will make it easier for him to cling to this truth: Even when all seems lost, God is still worthy of my devotion.

The truths that have encouraged me recently come from Acts. As we approach Easter, I am struck by what the apostles went through, watching Jesus die on the cross. So much they didn't understand! In Acts 1:4-5 Jesus told them to "wait for what the Father had promised ... not many days from now...". I'm sure they wanted to ask, "How many days??" In Acts 1:14, we see what they did while they waited: "These all with one mind were continually devoting themselves to prayer." The words the Lord keeps bringing to my mind are, "Pray and wait." Please continue to pray that God will clearly lead us to the man that He has already chosen...not many days from now! We cannot express how encouraging it is to hear of your faithful prayers. We rejoice that we serve an omniscient, omnipresent, and omnipotent God.

May He find us faithful as we wait, serve, and pray in this transition!



Looking for the Sun Above the Clouds

"Here in Ukraine we are looking for the sun above the clouds - the bright stars shining in the dark sky. But the true hope is found at the cross. You probably don't need to hear this. But Ukraine does." – David, Day 19 of War

On February 24, Russia began their full-scale attack on Ukraine as the world watched in sadness and horror. First Evan Missionaries, David and Katya have made their *Kreativity* School and 3:17 Café government approved bomb shelters and are housing refugees, along with trying to keep their three children safe. Although they are in central Ukraine and safer than the areas surrounding, they are constantly having to shelter due to air raid sirens. The Ukrainians have a comical reason for this safety, but David knows it's God's protection:

"The Ukrainian explanation for this is that when the Russians were planning their invasion, they rolled out a big map of Ukraine on their table, and placed an ashtray in the centre of the map. As the Russians smoked their cigarettes, deciding where to attack, they didn't realise that beneath their ashtray was the city [central Ukraine].

Our version, as followers of Jesus, is that the physical and spiritual dome of protection provided by heavenly angels, and reinforced by your prayers, is right now keeping us safe. Keep praying."

Just that weekend, the day after the war began, we kicked off our Global Missions Focus with our National Partners from Romania/Moldova, Poland, Slovakia, and Czech Republic. They returned home to a different world than they left with refugees flooding in from Ukraine, escaping war.

First Evan's International Disaster Fund is a line set aside for donors to give to people and countries in crisis. The past two years, we have raised money for COVID relief in various countries our National Partners and Missionaries are serving, as well as Haiti and Afghanistan. This time, our donors gave for Ukraine and Refugee relief. To date, \$27,380 has been raised for this cause and we have given:

\$11,000 to Novo for David and Katya, residing in Ukraine.

\$3,000 to Evangelical School of Theology in Poland where our National Partners Wojciech Szczerba and Marek Kucharski work.

\$2,000 to Novo for Eclesia Church's (*National Partners Dan and Ema Onu*) Ukraine refugee outreach in Moldova.

\$2,000 to Novo for Way of Joy's (National Partners Raul and Valentin Chirica) Ukraine refugee outreach in Romania.

\$2,000 to Integrity Discipleship Partners for In-Life's (National Partners Katya Blabolova and Gaby Gazova) in Czech Republic.

We are in communication with our other partners in Eastern/Central Europe, as they continue to assess the situation and communicate their needs. Thank you for caring for Ukraine and furthering God's Kingdom! This is an ongoing need, so please continue to give as you are lead at www.firstevan.org/disaster.

GMF Project - World Relief: Resettlement Memphis

"For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me...
'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.'" (Matthew 25:35, 40)

In the business world, we talk about investments; how to invest financially for you and your family's future. World Relief Memphis is expecting to house, care for, educate, and share the love of Jesus with over 300 refugees who have and will make their way to the 901, this year alone—what does that require? Your time. Your gifts. Your heart. We all have these three things and they are given to us directly by God. World Relief has many opportunities for you to give in this way. You can use your gift of speaking the English language—a gift that we take for granted (English is the world's most used language for business and trade) and you can help these refugees learn by becoming a Conversation Partner. You can use your time by becoming a Roadrunner and providing transportation. You can give your heart by walking alongside families and youth by being part of a Good Neighbor Team or becoming a Youth Mentor.

Investment in these things is so important, as Matthew 25:40 says. Doing these things is as if you are doing them for the Lord Himself. This is HUGE!

Money is also an integral part of bolstering the lives of these 300+ refugees and we are so grateful for all of you who gave to this great, Kingdom cause! \$21,175 was given by 45 donors, exceeding our goal! This will be given to World Relief Memphis to give the much needed care and shelter for our new neighbors. Thank you ALL!

Global Missions Focus "Partnership in the Gospel"

By partnering with our friends, we combine our resources to advance the Kingdom of God in some very difficult areas.

The question at the beginning of the Global Missions Focus was "How does God want me to be engaged in taking the Gospel to the Nations?" This question remains. As we all pray how God will lead us personally, let's also pray about how God will further use First Evan corporately to share the Good News of Jesus Christ to a world that is in turmoil and needs the hope of the Gospel!
