A Case for Pace by the Pastoral Search Committee

The Session has unanimously voted to recommend **Kenton Pace McKee (Pace)** as the candidate for Senior Pastor. We believe that Pace is the man God has selected to encourage and equip us to build on our God-given strengths of sound doctrine, strong expository preaching, spiritual growth, and a passion to evangelize and make disciples of all nations.

Pace, 34, is the Pastor of Family Ministries at Harvest Church. His family moved to Memphis when Pace was in the 2nd grade. While at Houston High School, he came to know the Lord and was discipled by a youth pastor at Germantown Baptist Church. He earned a bachelor's degree at the University of Kansas where he was very involved in Navigators. At the suggestion of his mentors, he interned at Second Baptist Church in Houston, TX prior to starting a career in finance. God changed his career path and Pace served as the High School Pastor at Second Baptist. He earned his Master of Divinity from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary where he is working on a Doctor of Educational Ministry degree.

While working at Second Baptist he met and married his wife, Jenn, who also worked with the youth. Jenn shares the same vision for evangelism, discipleship, and missions as Pace. Jenn was considering the mission field when they met. They have three children: James Thomas (7), Kenton (5) and Lawrence (3).

Pace and Jenn moved to Memphis in 2015 to start the youth ministry at Harvest Church. One reference commented that Pace "creates ministry." He soon became Pastor of Family Ministries. Following the plane crash in 2023, which deeply shocked Harvest Church, Jamie Trussell was chosen to become Interim Lead Pastor, standing in for Kennon Vaughan. Jamie asked the elders to select Pace as Interim Executive Pastor until they replaced Bill Garner, who died in the accident. Several references noted the

difficulty of shepherding a staff and congregation who were grieving, while he and Jenn were also suffering great loss of close friends. They confirmed that Pace has a shepherd's heart for people of all ages.

Pace described God's leading toward a senior pastor role as a polaroid photo developing in his heart over the last three years. Through affirmation and encouragement from mentors and co-laborers, Pace began to detect a vision and passion for a role broader than student and family ministry. With his strong administrative skills, Pace and Jenn assumed he would eventually become an executive pastor. As the photo developed, the Lord made the call to be a senior pastor more clear. Pace is passionate about leading all ages toward fulfilling the Great Commission—evangelism, discipleship, shepherding and equipping the entire church for ministry. Pace's time as interim executive pastor was an important part of God's call to a senior pastor role.

Our search committee considered over 300 men for this position, but it was through conversations with Ronnie Stevens and others at Harvest that Pace became a candidate who stood out. What the search committee discovered was a man who is a gifted communicator, who is passionate about discipleship, biblical literacy, and missions, and who is a good cultural fit for First Evan. Fellow pastors and elders, church members, mentors, co-workers, and friends, speak of him as someone they trust as a shepherd, a man of integrity and vision, who loves prayer, God's word, and has tremendous potential as an expository preacher.

In the next column are a few highlights of Pace's character and ministry that the session believes are a great fit for First Evan for today and the future. A few seasoned pastors recommended that we find a Senior Pastor who exhibits competence in preaching, shepherding (pastoral care), and leadership/administration.

They said good senior pastors must be strong in one of these, preferably two. Pace is reported and has demonstrated strengths in all three:

- **Pulpit Ministry:** Pastors whom we all know well affirm what we have heard for ourselves: Pace is a solid expository preacher, steeped in the Word, has sound theology, and has a robust hermeneutic and homiletical approach. He works hard to know his congregation well and strives for his sermons to engage all listeners.
- **Shepherding:** Multiple references state that people thrive under Pace's leadership. He clearly articulates a vision that resonates with our challenges of imparting a godly legacy, seeking the lost, and shepherding the flock. Though he has primarily focused on student and family ministry, he ministers to all age groups.
- **Leadership:** Pace has significant leadership experience: overseeing a very large youth ministry in Houston, starting and developing student and family ministries from scratch at Harvest, and fulfilling the interim executive pastor role during very difficult times. Elders note his skill as an elder at Harvest: He presents his ideas carefully, listens to others, gains consensus, and leads in the direction corporately decided.

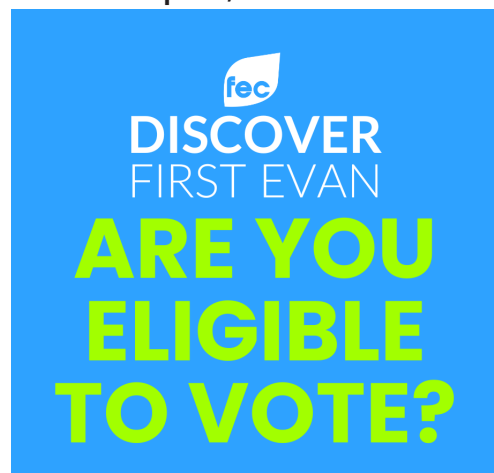

On the agenda will be the election of Elders, Deacons, Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Congregation, and Global Missions Team members who will begin serving in July. In addition, we will be voting on the 2024–2025 church budget. A Dessert Fellowship will follow the meeting.

Reminder, you must be a member to vote and a provision for proxy voting is available for those who cannot attend due to illness, being out of town, or scheduled work conflict.

Voting Eligible?

The church Constitution affords voting rights to active members age 18 and older. It is important to ensure your membership status is where it needs to be, for you to be eligible to vote.

Membership Requirements:

Folks are often surprised to learn even though they grew up, and were even baptized at First Evan, they are not actually members. Attending our Discover First Evan class, an interview with an elder, and signing the Membership Confession is required to become a member of First Evan.

Active vs. Inactive Membership:

Others may be surprised to learn because they have not been active at the church for a long time, their membership status was changed to “Inactive Member”, per the constitution. Efforts are always made to contact people and find out their intentions before such a change is made, but if you have been away for a while and we were unable to reach you and get a response, your membership status might have been changed to “Inactive”. Inactive members are not eligible to vote. You can check your profile on TouchPoint or call the church office to confirm your status.

Ensuring Active Member Status:

We are offering a Discover First Evan class on the afternoon of April 7 from 4:00–6:00 p.m. for anyone that would like to begin the membership process. If you desire to continue the membership process after attending the class, we will make sure you have opportunity to have an elder interview prior to any vote on a senior pastor. If you find your membership status is currently “Inactive”, all you need to do is re-engage with the church and let us know by email, text, or letter that you wish to return to “Active Member” status. It’s that simple.

Proxy Voting:

The constitution is very specific on the matter of voting by proxy.

Article V; Section 6.

A. Proxy Votes: A Voting Member may vote at all meetings of the Members by proxy **if prevented from attendance by ill health, work schedule, or absence from the Memphis metropolitan area**, but proxy votes may not be solicited and no one Voting Member may cast proxy votes for more than two others. Before casting a proxy vote a Voting Member shall provide a written statement appointing him as proxy for a specific meeting, signed by the Voting Member whom he represents.

Forms for appointing a “Proxy” will be available online at www.firstevan.org/voting, from the church office, and at the Connect Center. To request one by email, send a request to office@firstevan.org.

Let us all do our part to ensure a seamless and smooth voting process. Call the office if you are unsure of your membership status while there is plenty of time to get things taken care of if needed.

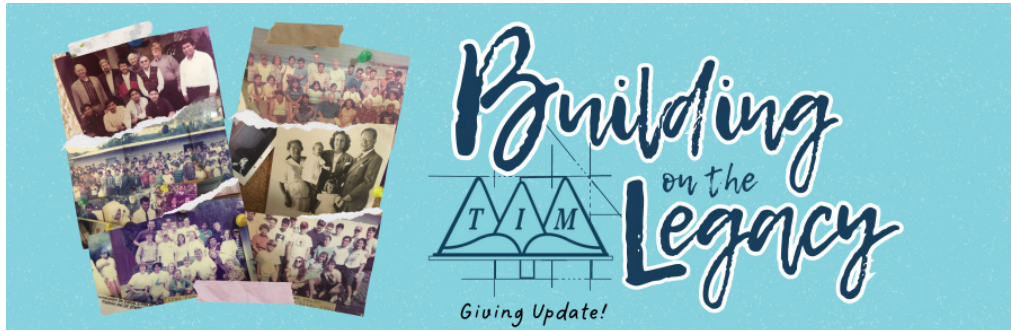

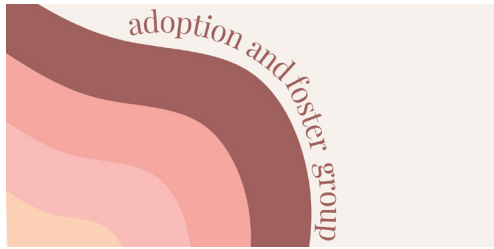
