Guarding the Path

During my senior year of high school, I had an interest in attending seminary in Portland, OR. So, I visited that seminary, and while on that trip, I learned that guard rails are important. The day I visited the seminary I left my home in Puyallup, WA early that morning, driving south on Interstate 5 to meet a guidance counselor and tour the campus. After a wonderful visit and tour, I started my return drive home about mid-afternoon. It was a terrific spring day, warm and sunny. Perhaps it was too nice, because somewhere near Chehalis, WA I found myself driving at an angle, with one side of my truck's wheels riding up on the cement jersey wall (or guard rail). I was quite startled and somewhat terrified! As it turns out, I had fallen asleep, driving about 55 miles per hour, crossing two lanes of Interstate 5. I am thankful for that guard rail, because without it I would have veered into the oncoming traffic. And by God's grace I did not hit anyone, injure myself, nor was there any damage to my truck. Needless to say, I pulled over, settled down, thanked God for His provision and was wide awake!

In that instance, I let my guard down, allowing myself to become too comfortable on a warm, sunny afternoon, nodding off and not pulling over to get necessary rest. Thankfully, I can testify on that day, that guard rail kept up its side of the deal saving me from causing harm to others or to myself.

In previous *Shepherd's Staff* articles (listed in the next paragraph and at www.firstevan.org/newsletters) we discussed how Nehemiah had concern for the Israelites and Jerusalem, hearing disturbing reports of their condition. He set out to see the people and assess the situation in Jerusalem



and initiate a plan according to God's guidance and direction.

While executing the plan to restore the people and rebuild Jerusalem's walls and gates, Nehemiah encountered opposition. The opposition attempted to dissuade the people from rebuilding the wall, and discredit Nehemiah and his leadership.

When Nehemiah heard of and experienced the opposition, he trusted God to protect them. He had his servants stand guard (Nehemiah 4:9) with half of them "carrying spears, shields, bows, and coats of mail," while the other half "worked on construction." And he and others were on high alert "night and day, not letting their guard down" (Nehemiah 4:16, 22-23) to stand against the enemy.

Nehemiah is an example for us to keep our guard up when opposition arises. And it will arise. Our opposition is Satan who prowls and seeks to divide or sift and destroy God's people. Thankfully, Jesus prays that our "faith may not fail" us (Luke 22:31-32). When I was driving home that spring day, I let my guard down, but thankfully there was a "guard rail" in place to keep me safe.

During our [Annual Congregational Meeting](#) last month, I presented our [On Mission](#) report that included Six Vital Challenges, three backward-looking (*Give Grace, Preserve Unity, and Stand Strong*) and three forward-looking (*Impart a Godly Legacy, Seek the Lost, and Work Smart*). The *Stand Strong* challenge acknowledges that the enemy, Satan and his evil associates, seeks to sift us and suppress the gospel. Through our newly formed Polity and Doctrine committee, "we will, in reliance on the strength and wisdom that Jesus supplies, identify Satan's attempts to work our harm and will actively employ prayer, God's Word, and mutual encouragement to resist him."

In the meantime, we can practice standing strong by putting on the full armor of God as described in Ephesians 6:10-20 where we are instructed to fasten on the belt of truth, put on the breastplate of righteousness, prepare our feet with the gospel of peace, take up the shield of faith to extinguish the flaming darts of the evil one, taking the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God, and praying at all times. God gives us strength to stand guard and the tools to do so. And Nehemiah demonstrated what it looks like to stand guard. How will you and I stand guard against the attacks of the enemy?

As for me I strive to keep my eyes alertly on the road and off the guard rails, though I continue to dent a few here and there!

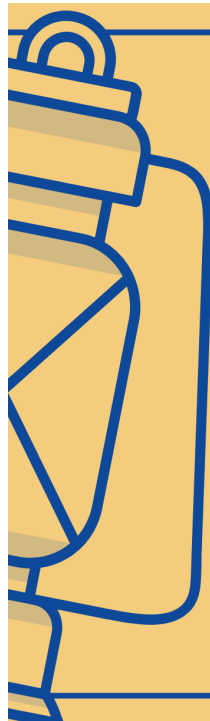

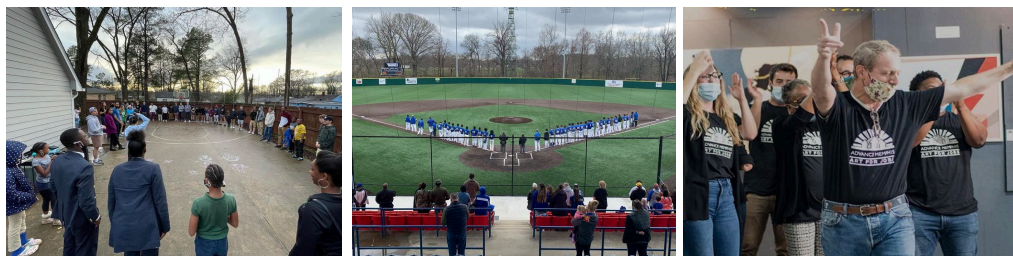

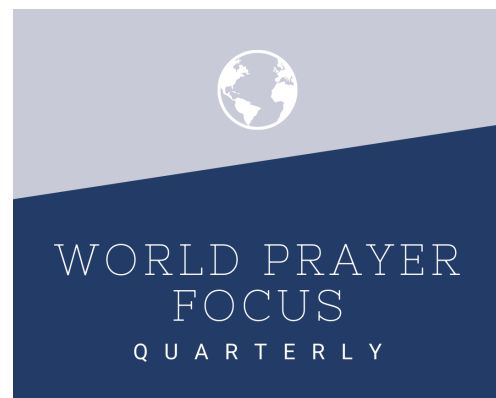
