Telling God What to Say

For this is a rebellious people, false sons, sons who refuse to listen to the instruction of the Lord; who say to the seers, "You must not see visions;" and to the prophets, "You must not prophesy to us what is right, speak to us pleasant words, prophesy illusions" (Isaiah 30:9-10).

This declaration from the prophet Isaiah was given to Israel at a time when commitment to God had waned. Israel's bodies were in "church" but their hearts were elsewhere (Isaiah 29:13). They were merely going through the motions with God.

One of the symptoms of their problem was their taste in preachers. They liked "positive" preaching. The people wanted to hear something that made them feel good, even if it meant playing a little fast and loose with the truth.

There is nothing intrinsically wrong with encouragement and encouraging sermons. But when we are off track, we need rebuke. Dictating to God which one He may use won't end well. So here's a great heart check you can perform before assembling for worship. Invite God to tell you whatever He thinks you need, whether pleasant or convicting. Assure Him that you want to know the truth more than you want to be entertained or made to feel good.

If you can honestly do this from the heart, your heart becomes an open invitation for God to work. And God will not leave you disappointed. He will give you something more precious than gold: He will reveal the next step you can take to become like His Son.

It has often been said that plans are only dreams unless they turn into action steps. Thankfully, after a lot of assessment and development of plans, we are moving fairly rapidly toward action steps. We do want to ensure that every action step can be traced back to our *On Mission* six challenges. Currently, our Polity & Doctrine Committee is working on the doctrine side of our responsibilities (more about polity as it relates to effective governance structures and empowered leaders in future articles)!

In our initial meeting, Pastor Jim asked our group to take on an assignment to assist the work of the Search Committee. They need to maintain their focus upon "filtering" applications. However, once they have identified candidates for further discussion, then we need to be able to ensure doctrinal alignment with First Evan. We are working on providing a resource to the Search Committee which would enable them to have discussions with candidates around doctrinal essentials and doctrinal distinctives (defined as their teaching positions in doctrinal areas of significance). Clearly, we want to discern that Pastor Next is theologically sound but has a theology that is grace filled.

The committee also felt that this process would not only benefit the Search Committee but also help us as we tackle our next challenge relating to our unity statement. Thank you for your continued prayers for the committee, and we look forward to providing further updates on our action steps to support the *On Mission* efforts.



LOVE!!! by Missions Director and Assistant Jim Pendleton and Tori Martin

What if you had never been inside a church before? What if you had never known a Christian in your family? What if you had never known a Christian among your work colleagues?

Then, what is the single most important thing that your first impression of the Christian community is dependent upon? Is it an articulate Gospel presentation? Is it great skill in apologetic arguments?

OR...is LOVE/ACCEPTENCE the single most important thing?

This is the single thing that characterized our one-week experience at the In-Life Evangelistic English Camp in the Czech Republic in July. In conversation after conversation with unbelievers, the recurring theme was that the In-Life community of believers were loving and accepting of everyone!

And then, this unconditional love earned us the right as believers to share our stories of how Jesus changed our lives.

The fun thing was to see over the course of the week how God softened hearts. Though they knew that In-Life was a Christian organization, many unbelievers came who were skeptical and guarded. But, they saw real people sharing their real lives.

JETS Mission Trip by Ron Man, Missionary in Residence

It was good to be back teaching at Jordan Evangelical Theological Seminary after having to Zoom teach my course the past 2 years. This was my 7th trip to JETS, and I love being among Christians in the Middle East! Such a strategic ministry.

My class had 10 students (a few of them attending by Zoom): 5 from Jordan, 3 from Sudan, 1 from South Sudan, and 1 Iraqi who lives in Greece. It was a good group, and they responded really well to the teaching on the biblical foundations of worship.

One evening during the 2-week course, I gave a seminar for worship leaders, pastors, and other church leaders from Amman and beyond. About 50 attended, representing Baptist, Christian and Missionary Alliance, Nazarene, Free Evangelical,

and Assemblies of God churches. A few former students from my previous visits to JETS came-including one, Yousef, a young Egyptian (now on staff at a church in Jordan) who led the worship time; he also shared with me, and then with the group, how the course he took with me 9 years ago had impacted his life and shaped his ministry. So encouraging! I spoke on the topic "Jesus, the True Leader of Our Worship," drawn from my book Proclamation and Praise; and at the end of the evening each participant was gifted with a copy of the Arabic translation of my book (released that evening for the first time). (A number of you helped with the funding for that project, thank you!)

Ironically, the temperatures there were about 15 degrees cooler than what you were facing in Memphis!!
